
HERO Program - Low Cost Financing for Home Improvements

HERO Financing is a low cost, fixed interest rate financing for a broad range of energy and water efficient products and renewable energy systems, and is offered through a partnership between the Western Riverside Council of Governments and Renovate America. Through this program, homeowners repay the HERO Financing through their property tax bill. Eligible projects include:

- * Air Sealing and Weatherization
- * Cool Roof and Wall System
- * Energy Audits
- * Indoor Water efficiency
- * Instillation
- * Lighting Measures
- * Pool Equipment
- * Water Heating
- * Window, skylights and door improvements
- * Solar Thermal



The program's purpose is to provide low interest rate financing to spark the local economy by creating jobs, reducing utility costs and reducing greenhouse emissions. HERO Financing is repaid through an assessment on your property tax bill over 5-20 years, based on the useful life of the products, and upon sale of the property, the balance generally stays with the property. Be Water Wise!

In January, Governor Jerry Brown proclaimed a drought State of Emergency in the State of California and called for statewide water conservation. The Governor's announcement follows a series of actions the administration has taken to ensure that California is prepared for record dry conditions. California is facing the worst drought in history and we all need to do our part, conserve water for all of its uses and to make every effort to reduce water waste in order to conserve this precious natural resource. Residents are asked to voluntarily reduce their water usage by 20% in response to the ongoing statewide drought.

The City itself is trying to do its part utilizing drip irrigation, having the City landscape contractor regularly inspect and replace broken sprinklers, utilize weather sensing irrigation clocks, and installing drought tolerant landscape around the Civic Center.

Bradbury residents are encouraged to take simple steps to save water, including taking shorter showers, not leaving water running, checking for leaks, washing only full laundry loads, not washing vehicles at home, promptly fixing defective plumbing or sprinklers, watering only when landscaping needs it during early morning hours twice a week, avoiding sprinkler runoff into paved areas, and using a broom rather than a hose to clean driveways, gutters and walkways.

Donnie L. Mauldin named New Captain at Temple Station



Capt. Donnie Mauldin, a 33-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, was recently promoted to the rank of Captain by Sheriff John Scott, and has assumed command of the Temple Sheriff's station, which services Bradbury, Duarte and other San Gabriel Valley cities.

Captain Mauldin's career with the Sheriff's Department began in 1981 when he was hired as a Law Enforcement Intern and assigned to the then-Antelope Valley Station. In 1982, he attended the Department's Training Academy as a member of Class #211. After graduating as a Deputy Sheriff, he held assignments at East Facility, Firestone Station and the Emergency Operations Bureau. Captain Mauldin was promoted to Sergeant in 1992, and worked at the East Los Angeles Station, Scientific Services Bureau and the Internal Affairs Bureau. In 2001, he was promoted to Lieutenant and worked at the North County Correctional Facility, Internal Affairs Bureau, West Hollywood Station, Professional Development Bureau, Training Bureau/Recruit Training, Commercial Crimes Bureau, Internal Affairs Bureau, and the Executive Offices as an aide to Sheriff Scott. Captain Mauldin was introduced to the Bradbury City Council and community at the July City Council meeting.

Captain Mauldin was born and raised in the Antelope Valley and currently resides in Los Angeles. In his spare time, he enjoys working out, hiking, playing tennis, and traveling.
