

ORDINANCE NO. 336

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADBURY
AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE BRADBURY MUNICIPAL CODE TO
ADOPT THE COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE WITH REVISIONS
AND ASSIGN THE PASADENA HUMANE SOCIETY TO PERFORM CERTAIN
DUTIES (BRADBURY MUNICIPAL CODE ARTICLE IV CHAPTER 10)**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRADBURY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN
AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Article IV, Chapter 10, of the Bradbury Municipal Code, Animals and
Pound Service, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 4200, Adopted, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4200. Adopted.

This Chapter shall be known and may be referred to in all proceedings as the
Animal Control Ordinance.

Except as provided in this Chapter, "TITLE 10 – ANIMALS" of the County of Los
Angeles Code, as amended through Ordinance 2013-0033, being the animal
control ordinance of the County of Los Angeles, is adopted by reference, with the
exception of Chapter 10.90 relating to fees, as the animal control ordinance of the
City and may be cited as such. This Ordinance shall regulate the care, custody,
licensing, impounding, maintaining, sale and exhibition of animals.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this Chapter, the specific provisions of any
contract between the City and the Pasadena Humane Society shall supersede
the provisions of Los Angeles County Ordinance 2013-0033.

Zoning regulations regarding farm animals shall continue to be governed by the
provisions of Chapter 9.06.100.020 –Animal Raising and Keeping of the Bradbury
Municipal Code.

Animal Control fees shall be adopted by resolution of the City Council.

A copy of said Ordinance of the County of Los Angeles has been and is now on
file in the office of the City Clerk of the City and may be examined by the public.

Section 4201, Definitions, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4201. Definitions.

Whenever any of the following names or terms are used in said ordinance of the
County of Los Angeles, each such name or term shall be deemed construed to
have the meaning ascribed to it in this section, as follows:

- (A) "County", "County of Los Angeles" or "unincorporated territory" shall mean the City of Bradbury.
- (B) "Board of Supervisors" shall mean the City Council of the City of Bradbury.
- (C) "County clerk" means the city clerk of the City of Bradbury.
- (D) "Department" or "Society" shall mean the Pasadena Humane Society.
- (E) "Director" shall mean the Poundmaster of the Pasadena Humane Society.

Section 4202, Enforcement, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4202 Enforcement.

(A) Police powers: The poundmaster, if a person, or the deputy poundmaster, shall be vested with the powers and duties of a police officer of the City, and shall have the power and it shall be his duty to make arrests for violations of any of the provisions of this title. The poundmaster shall enforce all of the laws and regulations of the City and State relating to the care, treatment, impounding and quarantining of dumb animals and to the prevention of cruelty to dumb animals.

B) Humane officers—Authority, citation and arrest Any employee of the poundmaster who is a qualified humane officer under the laws of the state, may issue notices to appear in court as prescribed by state law for any violations of state and local animal control laws occurring within the City, including but not limited to violations of Title 6; provided such employees shall not be authorized to take any person into custody even though the person to whom the notice is delivered does not give his written promise to appear in court. This section shall in no way limit the power of police officers of the city to issue citations and make arrests.

C) Poundmaster—License and tax powers The poundmaster, if a person, or the deputy poundmaster, shall be vested with the powers and duties of a deputy city assessor, tax and license collector, and shall have the power, as directed by the city assessor, tax and license collector, and shall have the power, as directed by the city assessor, tax and license collector, to collect the license fees and to issue the certificates and tags prescribed herein. All sums so collected shall be paid over to the city treasurer in accordance with any contract with the Pasadena Humane Society.

D) Poundmaster—Power as health officer The poundmaster, if a person, or the deputy poundmaster, shall be vested with the powers and duties of a deputy health officer of the City and shall have the power and it shall be his duty to enforce all laws and regulations of the City and the state relating to the capture, isolation, quarantine or destruction of animals.

Section 4203, Fees, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4203. Fees.

Title 10 of the Los Angeles County Code, as adopted by the City Council, is amended throughout to delete, "fees set forth in Section 10.90.010", and in each occurrence, shall be replaced with fees established by resolution of the City Council of the City of Bradbury.

[4204. Violations of Penalty. – remains unchanged.]

4205. Adoption of Los Angeles County Dangerous Dog Ordinance.
is hereby deleted, as said ordinance is already incorporated by reference herein by section 4200.

[4206. Keeping of Bees. – remains unchanged.]


[4207. Inoculation of Horses. – remains unchanged.]

SECTION 2: Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3: The City Clerk shall certify as to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause the summary thereof to be published within fifteen (15) days of the adoption and shall post a certified copy of this Ordinance, including the vote for and against the same, in the office of the City Clerk.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance will become effective on the thirty-first (31st) day following its adoption.




