

Pasadena Humane Society to take over Bradbury Animal Care & Control

The City of Bradbury is proud to announce that it will be partnering with the Pasadena Humane Society for animal welfare and control services beginning July 1, 2014.

The Pasadena Humane Society (PHS) is an independent, donor-supported, non-profit agency that provides animal care for abandoned and homeless animals. An open door agency, PHS welcomes and cares for all animals in its service area regardless of age, medical condition, breed or any other criteria. Bradbury will be the ninth city the Pasadena Humane Society & SPCA partners with in providing essential animal support services including dog and cat licensing.



Current licenses issued through the County of Los Angeles Animal Care & Control will be transferred to the Pasadena Humane Society, so you will not need to purchase an additional license if your current one is still active.

If you need to purchase or renew your license prior to July 1st, please go through the County of Los Angeles as your license will be transferred once the switch in services occurs.

Remember, California state law requires all dogs four months and older be vaccinated against rabies and be licensed in their area of residence. Cats are also required to be vaccinated for rabies at four months of age and licensed.

Licensing is an important means of identification and can help to return lost pets to their owners quickly. Licenses are valid for one year from the date of purchase.

Get Involved and Protect Your Neighborhood !

The City of Bradbury and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department want residents to be aware. Crime prevention is a job for you and your neighbors because you are the best people to do it. You are encouraged to develop relationships in your neighborhood. You and your neighbors can work together in a program of mutual assistance by organizing groups, holding regular neighborhood watch meetings, and keeping lines of communication open with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Remember that you are a proactive part of law enforcement.

- ☞ Report specific suspicious activity and unsafe situations as they occur
- ☞ Coordinate Neighborhood Watch Meetings as needed
- ☞ Assist law enforcement by relaying important crime information related to your neighborhood and keeping it safe

How do I get involved?

It's simple:

- ☞ Use your eyes and ears and then your telephone.
- ☞ If you spot something suspicious, call Temple Station at (626) 448-9861 and report it.

LA Sheriff's Department would like to remind residents that there are things that you can do to help keep your home, neighborhood, and family safe. Important tips to remember:

- ⇒ Make your home look occupied, leave the TV, radio, or lights on, or your dog in the backyard.
- ⇒ Lock all doors, windows, and garage doors before you leave the house or go to bed.
- ⇒ Use motion detector lights outside.
- ⇒ Don't allow daily deliveries of mail, newspaper or flyers to build up while you are away. Arrange for the post office to hold your mail, or a friend or neighbor to collect mail regularly.
- ⇒ Push-button locks on doorknobs are easy for burglars to open. Install deadbolt locks on all your outside doors.
- ⇒ Keep your yard clean and bushes and trees trimmed. Do not give burglars a place to hide.
- ⇒ If you have an alarm system, use it, even if you leave for a short period of time.
