General Municipal Election on April 13, 2010

Filing Period for City Council Seats Districts 3 & 5

The City of Bradbury will be holding an election for the City Council seats for Districts 3 and 5. This occurs every four years.

Candidates desiring to run may file nomination papers at City Hall with the City Clerk from December 21, 2009 to January 15, 2010; extended to January 19, 2010 for non-incumbents if an incumbent does not file. Only registered voters residing in District 3 and 5 are eligible to run for office.

And don't forget if you are a new voter or have moved the last day to register to vote for the April election is March 29th. Registration forms are available at City Hall.

Dry Goods boxed stuffing, boxed rice dishes, hamburger helper, box mashed potatoes, cereal, pasta

Staples flour, sugar (brown, powdered), salt, cornstarch, baking powder, cinnamon, pepper

Sweets Jell-O, pudding, chocolate chips, cake mixes, frosting, cookie mixes, muffin mixes, fruit rolls, granola bars

Canned Food fruit, beans, corn, pumpkin, okra, yams, milk, tuna/chicken, soup

Beverages bottled water, baby formula

Clothes colorful ankle socks, canvas belts, athletic socks, white t-shirts, diapers

Toys Infant to 2 years, 2 – 5 years, 6 to pre-teen

Electronics/Music \$5 phone cards, digital cameras, AAA batteries, AA batteries, C batteries, watches, headphones, portable players

Personal Items Barrettes, Bows/Ribbons, scrunches/ headbands, bracelets, earrings, lotion, perfume/aftershave, hand creams, hair gel/spray, toothpaste, bar soap, liquid soap, hairbrushes, shampoo, conditioner, bubble bath

The City Council met on October 20th and took the following actions:

- Approved the Fiscal Year 2008-2009 Annual Financial Audit Report, the SCAG (Southern California Association of Governments) Growth Forecast for the City of Bradbury, renewal of the Contract with the Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control, changing the regular meeting time of the Planning Commission from 7:30 pm to 7:00 pm and approved a donation request to AYSO Region 2 VIP (see page ..).
