Recognizing District 1 Volunteers

Two amazing men lead the volunteer team of District I, Frank Hernandez and Greg Wood. Frank Hernandez has served on the Planning Commission since 2004 and the District representative to the Emergency Response Committee. In his emergency role Frank is responsible for preparing District I in the event of an emergency and possible evacuation should the need occur. During the past year he assisted with the City's first May Day Emergency Preparedness Expo. Frank also served on Civic Center Committee which worked diligently over the past few years to redesign City Hall. Last year, the City recognized Frank Hernandez as Citizen of the Year for his outstanding contributions to the Bradbury Community.

Greg Wood also commits an extraordinary amount of time serving on two Committees for the City; the Emergency Response Committee as the alternate to Frank Hernandez and the City's Beautification Committee. In addition to his Committee work, Greg was the Citizen lead in the City's successful application to the California Fire Safe Council Clearinghouse. The monies awarded from that grant application has allowed the City to embark on an aggressive fire reduction project on overgrown brush outside of the 200 foot brush clearance. To date, the fire reduction work has occurred on over 120 acres throughout the City. When the project is completed it is projected that over 200 acres will have been treated within the City's boundaries. As a member of the of the newly formed Beautification Committee, Greg will work to promote and encourage community pride through the recognition of excellence in landscape design and maintenance on properties located throughout the City.

Burrtec Waste Services will be having their Community Cleanup in Bradbury on Thursday October 8, Friday October 9 and Saturday October 10. Three convenient drop-off locations will be located at:

- City Hall 600 Winston Ave
- Corner of Mount Olive Drive and Gardi Street
- Corner of Deodar and Bliss Canyon Road

Burrtec will supervise the disposal site on Saturday. Please be prepared to provide proof of residency; your Burrtec bill will work. The Burrtec sites will be accepting all residential **non-hazardous** waste and non-electrical waste. Only the City Hall Location will be collecting E-Waste. If you would like more information about items that will be accepted, please contact Burrtec at (626) 932-1558.

*E-waste items include consumer electronic equipment that has reached its "end-of-life", "end of usage", whether in full or non-working condition. Most electronic equipment with a cord or circuit board such as: Computer Monitors, Printers, PC System, Laptops, Power Supplies, Mother Boards, Networking Equipment, Copiers, Scanners, Fax Machines, VCR/DVD Players, Cell Phones, and Car Batteries. Refrigerators, Microwave Ovens, and Washing/Drying Machines Will **Not** Be Accepted.

Household Hazardous Waste can be disposed of on **Saturday, October 10th** at the City of Hope's Parking Lot - 2144 Buena Vista, Duarte from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Examples of Household Hazard Waste include brake fluid, paint, paint thinner, cleaners with acid or lye, pesticides or herbicides, household batteries and car batteries, pool chemicals, motor oil, filters, expired pharmaceuticals, anti-freeze and fluor

Through a great partnership with Census 2010, the City has been able to purchase an emergency supply duffle bag for each household. The purpose of the bags is to incentivize residents to start preparing their own emergency bags to keep on hand in their car, at work or home. Each bag comes with a number of emergency related documents including Los Angeles County Fire Department's Ready! Set! Go! Brochure that will help you prepare your family's Personal Wildfire Action Plan. Even if you already have an emergency supply bag, we strongly urge you to stop by City Hall and pick up these valuable documents. The lessons from the ongoing Station Fire should serve as a reminder to all that living in Southern California comes with inherit emergency situations caused by earthquakes and wildfires. The best way for one to mitigate against potential loss to life and property is to prepare and stay vigilant.
