The City of Bradbury's new Civic Center project will break ground this summer in late July. Following a redesign from the original concept and working with the Civic Center sub-committee and residents, the new Civic Center will include a new community room to accommodate meetings and presentations, the City's Emergency Operations Center, storage for official City records and administrative offices for City Hall. The City's current City Hall while a quaint and small facility is significantly out of compliance with today's public facility standards. The new facility will address these issues while maintaining the appearance and character of the neighborhood.

Don't Forget to Vaccinate Horses for West Nile Virus

The City of Bradbury does require the vaccination of all horses for the West Nile Virus (BMC 10, Article IV Section 4207) This disease has been previously identified as being present within a few miles of the City and is of serious concern since it infects both horses and humans. The simple vaccination takes only two injections and is not effective until three weeks after the second shot. The cost is nominal and can be obtained from an equine veterinarian. With the arrival of West Nile Virus this time of year it is essential that horses be vaccinated.

Keep Wildlife Safe

Part of Bradbury's charm is its cohesiveness with nature and its wildlife. Many residents enjoy watching the bear and deer in their backyards and as they drive through the streets. However, we must remember to be cautious so as not to put ourselves, families or the wildlife at risk.

- Never feed Bears! Report any neighbors or visitors who are feeding bears to the City.
- Securely block access to under-house crawl spaces.
- Do not use DeCon. It's sweetness attracts the bears.
- Don't leave garbage in or near the house.
- Don't leave pet food outside and don't feed pets outside.
- Don't talk nicely to the bears that come near your house. Let the bears know they are unwelcome. Be assertive - make the bear think you will harm him. Yell at the bear or use a boat horn.
