Keeping Stormdrains Clean of Pollution

In the last few weeks, the San Gabriel Valley has experienced a lot of rain. During these rainy days, it is important to consider what goes down our stormdrains. Stormdrains are responsible for carrying all stormwater (rain) to a local body of water.

The stormdrain system is not connected to the wastewater system, which drains water from the plumbing in private residences, commercial businesses and public facilities. Stormdrains do not send water to a treatment facility— everything that goes through the stormdrain, including rain water and any pollutants that are carried with it, lead to the ocean and/or other local bodies of water.



The diagram to the left depicts how toxic chemicals can enter the stormdrain from various sources such as cars leaking motor oil or antifreeze, lawns carrying pesticides and fertilizers, pet waste and littering. Consider the following tips to do your part to ensure only clean rainwater enters the stormdrain system:

- Clean up oil spills and fluid leaks from your car when parked in your driveway. Use cat litter to absorb oil and be sure to sweep up the litter once it absorbs the oil and dispose of it in the trash;
- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway, or move your car onto the lawn to wash it so water soaks into the ground and doesn't run into the stormdrain; and,
- Pick up pet waste and dispose of it in a trash can.
