


## FOOTHILL UNITY CENTER BACK TO SCHOOL DRIVE

Examples of Household Hazard Waste include brake fluid, paint, paint thinner, cleaners with acid or lye, pesticides or herbicides, household batteries and car batteries, pool chemicals, motor oil, filters, and expired pharmaceuticals. E-Waste includes computer monitors, televisions, CPU's, printers. Please bring items in a sturdy box, preferably in their original labeled containers. Please acknowledge Hazardous waste limit of 15 gallons per trip.

## Fourth of July & Firework Safety




Fireworks are often a part of special times like the 4th of July and New Year's Eve but they can be dangerous. Whenever you celebrate, learn how to protect yourself and those you care about from fireworks-related injuries. The risk of injury or death is elevated when using any type of fireworks. Even fireworks labeled as "Safe and Sane" can burn you, or even kill you. Fireworks account for two out of five fires, more than any other cause of fires.

### Fireworks are Prohibited in the City of Bradbury !

#### Illegal Fireworks

Any item that explodes, rises in the air, moves about the ground, or which are not approved and labeled "Safe and Sane" by the State Fire Marshal, is illegal in


## Mosquitoes & Vector Control

Global travel and trade have opened door to invasive mosquitoes. Three new species are establishing themselves in Southern California. The Asian tiger, the yellow fever, and the Australian backyard mosquitoes have all been detected and identified in Southern California. These insects can live and complete their life cycle either indoors or outdoors. Eggs are laid along the waterline of any water-holding container including plant saucers, fountains, buckets, used tires. Eggs can remain alive for years and hatch into larvae when conditions are right.
