Crime Stoppers

Los Angeles Regional Crime Stoppers: LA Regional Crime Stoppers is a non-profit organization that allows you to report crime without getting involved. You remain anonymous. If you know a crime has been committed, or may be committed, you can call the hotline 24 hours a day at 1-800-222-8477. On-line go to <http://www.lacrimestoppers.org>. You can also text your tip to 274637 then in the message space type TIPLA, type a space and then enter your crime information.

Please include detailed information (if known) such as the name of the person committing the crime, their address, vehicle, and a clear definition of the crime. You will receive a text with a secret code to start a secure text dialog with an operator.

Afterwards, delete your message to 274637. This system is not for use if you are the victim of the crime. A victim should call 911 or Temple Station at 626-285-7171.

Open House Safety

Here are some safety tips to protect your home and valuables during an open house showing:

- Create a home inventory checklist.
- Take pictures of your items and locations in each room.
- Store away valuable items in a locked room or safe.
- Consider using a webcam to record prospects.

Trash Day Reminder

Just as a reminder, Wednesday is trash collection day for the receptacles outside of the Estates and Woodlyn Ln. Thursday is collection day inside of the gated areas. It violates the City's municipal code to set out trash before 6:00pm on the day before pickup. Also, the receptacle shall not remain for more than twelve hours after it has been emptied.



Mosquitos & The Zika Virus

In the summer, mosquitos come out looking for a meal and a home to lay their eggs. They can carry viruses such as Zika, West Nile Virus, Chikungunya, etc.... Therefore, it is important to limit areas where mosquitos find attractive to lay their eggs.

A few measures to stop mosquito nests are, dump standing water from barrels and pots, change the water in bird baths, and clean roof gutters. For more information, visit the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District website.

Election Month Changes

At the July 17 Council Meeting, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 348. The ordinance cancels the City's April election and pushes the election to June.

Ordinance No. 348 was adopted to comply with the State's legislation that requires all municipalities to consolidate with state elections. Future elections will now be held in conjunction with the June primary.



Cal Recycle

You can get your beverage container recycling refunds on a per-container basis instead of by weight.

By law, you can bring up to 50 aluminum, 50 glass, 50 plastic, and 50 bi-metal California Redemption Value (CRV) containers in a single visit and request to be paid by count. You will be paid the full CRV redemption of 5 cents or 10 cents on each container. Inform the site attendant of your load content and how you would like to receive payment before you hand over your load.
