South Coast AQMD Residential EV Charging Incentive Pilot Program

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (South Coast AQMD) in collaboration with the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC) brings you a residential Electric Vehicle (EV) charging incentive pilot program to assist with Level 2 EV charger hardware costs.

On average, EV residential chargers range anywhere from \$400 to \$800. Through the incentive program, residents will be provided with up to \$250 to assist with the purchase of the EV charging hardware. Low-income residents may qualify for another incentive of up to \$250.

Fall Gardening Tips



With autumn among us, it is the perfect time to prepare your garden for the spring season. During this time it is ideal to clean up beds, manage soils, prepare sod and pull out tender summer bloomers. Taking the time to do fall garden maintenance work not only enhances the appearance of your yard, it also ensures that tender plants have enough care to protect them before the cooler weather in winter.

If you are considering planting some fall vegetables, below are a list of vegetables that do well during this season:

- Leafy Greens (e.g. lettuces, spinach, arugula, mustard)
- Kale (perfect selection to add for an edible landscape)
- Carrots
- Cabbage
- Broccoli
- Beets
- Onions & Garlic
- Potatoes
- Peas
- Radish



Keep in mind that while the cooler weather may deter some insect pests, do not be deceived as some species, such as snails and slugs, are attracted to these cooler temperatures. These critters can be picked off early in the morning or in the evening, or you may choose to utilize snail bait. Planting native plant species in your garden may also help attract natural snail and slug predators such as ground beetles, lizards and birds. However, the best way to manage the problem is to eliminate as many hiding places as possible including boards, stones, debris, weedy areas, dense ground covers, and areas where moisture can be trapped. For more tips, be sure to visit your local nursery store.
