



The Shake Out is an internationally recognized event meant to educate and prepare individuals and Families in in the event of an earthquake. Please join the City of Bradbury on October 20, 2016 in practicing "Drop, Cover and Hold On" protocol to protect lives during an earthquake.

**PROTECT YOURSELF. SPREAD THE WORD.**

#### What TO do:

- **DROP** to the ground (before the earthquake drops you!),
- Take **COVER** by getting under a sturdy desk or table, and
- **HOLD ON** to it until the shaking stops.

If there isn't a table or desk near you, drop to the ground in an inside corner of the building and cover your head and neck with your hands and arms. Do not try to run to another room just to get under a table..

#### What NOT to do:

- **DO NOT get in a doorway!** An early earthquake photo is a collapsed adobe home with the door frame as the only standing part. From this came our belief that a doorway is the safest place to be during an earthquake. In modern houses and buildings, doorways are no safer, and they do not protect you from flying or falling objects. Get under a table instead!
- **DO NOT run outside!** Running in an earthquake is dangerous, as the ground is moving and you can easily fall or be injured by debris. Running outside is especially dangerous, as glass, or other building components may be falling. You are much safer to stay inside and get under a table.

## Bradbury Clean-Up Days Sept. 29, 30 & Oct. 1

To assist property owners with maintaining their homes, Burrtec is making large refuse disposal bins available. For three days the community is invited and encouraged to take advantage of bins placed at three locations throughout the City to dump bulky items for FREE. E-Waste disposal will also be available at City Hall and **there will also be a free document shredding event at Bradbury City Hall on Saturday, October 1st.**

E-Waste items include consumer electronic equipment that has reached its “end-of-life”. Most electronic equipment with a cord or circuit board such as: Computer monitors, printers, PC systems, Laptops, Power Supplies, Mother Boards, Networking equipment, VCR/DVD players.

Please no tires, commercial waste and hazardous waste. Acceptable items include appliances such as dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves, water heaters; furniture such as chairs, couches, mattresses; or other miscellaneous items such as bundles of lumber/tree branches (48” max length) and toys. ## LASD Deputy Spotlight
