



SAN GABRIEL COMPLEX FIRE



On June 20th a small fire was reported by a driver on Highway 39. Within an hour of that initial 12 noon report the Reservoir Fire had transformed into the San Gabriel Complex Fire and had already been

deemed a significant threat to the neighboring communities of Azusa, Duarte, and Bradbury. The investigation as to what ignited the Fish Fire portion of the San Gabriel Fire Complex is still underway. Sparks emanating from an overturned vehicle near highway 39 is what began the Reservoir portion of the Fire Complex which alone scorched almost 1200 acres of land. The Fish Fire burned approximately 4300 acres of land.

Bradbury residents on Woodlyn Lane and Mount Olive Drive and all the adjacent streets were given mandatory evacuation orders from Public Safety and City officials. The City appreciates those residents who followed the evacuation orders. The City would also like to remind residents that with just a change in weather conditions the Fish Fire could have moved into Bradbury.

Public Safety officials from agencies including LA County Sheriffs, California Office of Emergency Management, Cities of Monrovia, Azusa, and Duarte various Fire Department Crews from Los Angeles County, and the United States Forestry Service, were all on hand to provide emergency support services to residents and evacuees. The City would like to extend its gratitude and appreciation to all of the emergency responders and public safety officials involved.

Fourth of July & Firework Safety

Fireworks are often a part of special times like the 4th of July and New Year's Eve but they can be dangerous. Whenever you celebrate, learn how to protect yourself and those you care about from fireworks-related injuries. The risk of injury or death is elevated when using any type of fireworks. Even fireworks labeled as "Safe and Sane" can burn you, or even kill you. Fireworks account for two out of five fires, more than any other cause of fires.

Fireworks are Prohibited in the City of Bradbury !

Illegal Fireworks

Any item that explodes, rises in the air, moves about the ground, or which are not approved and labeled "Safe and Sane" by the State Fire Marshal, is illegal in California. Pictured below are examples of illegal fireworks, and should not be used.
