

Last Chance to be Counted !



Welcome to Bradbury

The City is still collecting the Bradbury Counts! Questionnaire and beginning June 1 will be following up by phone with those residents who have not returned the form.

The City of Bradbury is currently conducting a special community count of all residents and employees who live in the community. Information collected will only be used for redistricting purposes. This project must be completed by June 30th in order to move the process along before the November 1, 2011 deadline.

Why should you be counted? The City Council needs an accurate count of the community for discussing the redistricting of Bradbury's City Council Districts. The City reviews it's voting districts every 10 years in accordance with the law. California State law provides that after each federal census the Bradbury City Council must determine whether adjustments to boundaries of any or all districts are needed.

Usually U.S. Census data is used for balancing district size but the 2010 Census data is to large a reporting area to be useful in Bradbury. So, the City needs your help in ensuring the count is accurate, please turn in the questionnaire to City Hall.



Metro Gold Line Foothill Extension

Pasadena - Azusa Extension

The Construction Authority and Skanska USA (the design-build team for the I-210 Bridge project) are in the final stages of design, and are now ramping up to start construction of the I-210 Bridge. In April and May, work commenced on pre-construction activities, including installation of the temporary soundwall and erosion-control measures. In June, grading will begin on the center and southern freeway medians, and a temporary retaining wall will be built along the center median. This effort will allow clearance of the right-of-way for the large construction equipment that will need to gain access to the bridge site over the next year of construction. Work on the bridge structure's foundations will begin this summer, keeping the

project on schedule to be completed in mid-2012.

Award of the design-build contract is anticipated in July for the Pasadena to Azusa Alignment package. This package will include construction of the six stations, maintenance and operations facility, 11.5-miles of track, crossings and much more. Construction on the Pasadena to Azusa Alignment will commence in mid-2012 with completion in late 2014.

Azusa - Montclair Extension

The Construction Authority is underway on a new environmental review of the Foothill Extension from Azusa to Montclair. The proposed project will extend the line 12.6-miles east of Azusa and include stations in Glendora, San Dimas, La Verne, Pomona, Claremont and Montclair.

In January, scoping meetings were held (formally beginning the environmental process) and in April and May community workshops were conducted for each of the station areas. Feedback received helped better define the station area plans and finalize the Project Description, which defines the project for environmental analysis.

Publication of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)/Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is anticipated in August 2011.

Clearing the project under state and federal regulations positions the project for possible state or federal funding.

Did You Know...?

Most car and property thefts can be prevented by following three simple guidelines: Don't leave property in plain view. Don't leave purses or other valuables in your car. Lock your car.

MONROVIA TRANSIT Available to Bradbury ... Check it out!

Through a great partnership with the City of Monrovia, the City of Bradbury has arranged to provide Monrovia Transit, a great community service, with low-cost, curb-to-curb transportation for residents and visitors. The Monrovia Transit vans will take anyone anywhere within the service area, which includes the entire City of Monrovia, un-incorporated areas, medical facilities at 620 Duarte Road, Arcadia Methodist Hospital and Arcadia Social Security office. Other locations include Target and Wal-Mart. All it takes is a call to the dispatch operator at (626) 358-3538. Requests for rides may be made up to half-an-hour before the start of service in the morning, and no later than a half-an-hour before the end of service in the evening.

FARES 75cents for seniors and persons with disabilities. \$1 for all others

HOURS Monday - 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m.

CHILDREN under 2 ride free. Children 2 and over will pay the regular fare of \$1 each. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES All Monrovia Transit vans are lift equipped. If regional transportation is desired, Access Services provides transportation throughout the San Gabriel Valley for persons with disabilities. For more information, call toll free 1-800-827-0829 (TDD 1-800-827-1359).

BEFORE YOU RIDE Monrovia Transit is a shared ride service, so for your convenience remember to:

- Have exact fare ready as drivers will not make change.
- Be prepared to board when the bus arrives. Drivers cannot wait more than one minute.
- Allow 20 to 30 minutes for response to a regular request.
- Plan for a slightly longer travel time than by private automobile. Buses may make additional stops.
